More than \$83,280 to below \$533,280	Between 90% and 0% The percentage goes down by 1% for every \$5,000 of income your family earns above \$83,280
\$533,280 or more	0%

If you have more than one child aged 5 or younger, you may get a <u>higher rate</u> for one or more of your children.

## CCS rates for higher rate children

Your family income	Child Care Subsidy percentage
\$0 to \$141,321	95%
More than \$141,321 to below \$186,321	Between 95% and 80%  The percentage goes down by 1% for every \$3,000 of income your family earns
\$186,321 to below \$265,611	80%
\$265,611 to below \$355,611	Between 80% and 50%  The percentage goes down by 1% for every \$3,000 of income your family earns
\$355,611, to below \$365,611	50%
\$365,611 or more	Higher CCS rates no longer apply, all children in the family will get the standard CCS rate

Example

Family earns - \$140,000 and works jointly over 48 hours per fortnight, they have 2 children and day care charges are \$130 per day per child.

(Diff between \$140,000 & \$83,280 = \$56,720) equates to 11.34% Child A eligible for reduction from 90% to 78.66% rebate = \$102.25 Therefore, Child A will cost parent \$27.74 per day

> Child B eligible for 95% rebate = \$123.50 Therefore, Child B will cost parent \$6.50 per day
